PREPARE TO ENTER THE GATEWAY

Ever heard of The Gateway Experience?

Supposedly, it was some sort of top-secret project the Army was conducting "years ago." Initially, it was just a series of experiments to try and see if subjects could be hypnotized and made to become remote viewers. They say the experiments worked, all too well. In fact, not only were the subjects able to remote view, but they also reported acquiring the ability to have out-of-body experiences and to visit other realms. That's when our government panicked and shut the whole project down...or did they?

Even if you've heard of The Gateway
Experience, you have to admit that's a pretty
sketchy-sounding description. Almost like
someone took a couple of cliché urban
legends and conspiracies and mixed them all
together. Well, what if I told you that within all
those outlandish claims there are tiny kernels
of truth? A bunch of them, actually. How about
that old tapes and manuals said to contain the
instructions and exercises for The Gateway
Experience have been recently discovered and
made their way of the headquarters of The
Ghosts Of Ohio? Got your attention with that
last bit, didn't I?

Well, while I can't give away too much yet, I can confirm that we have found someone to voluntarily participate in The Gateway Experience. What if anything happens to him will all be documented in future issues of this very newsletter!

More on that in a bit, but we should probably take a step back and separate fact from urban legend, Don't worry, it won't suck all the intrigue out of the story!

The story begins with Robert Allan Monroe, born October 30th, 1915). In 1953, Monroe created RAM Enterprises, a production company for

network radio programs. RAM Enterprises was so successful that just 3 years later, an R&D department was created by Monroe specifically to study something Monroe himself had become fascinated with: the idea that one could learn while sleeping.

Monroe was convinced that audio was the key. And wouldn't you know it, he just happened to have access to all sorts of audio equipment. Monroe felt that the right combination of tones and frequencies could open one's mind to essentially learn subconsciously. Monroe also wondered if using sound to try and sync the two sides of the brain—a process he would come to call Hemi-Sync—could unlock immeasurable abilities.

Never one to sit idle, Monroe would conduct the experiments on himself and almost immediately claimed to see results. But there were some things that, at least initially, Monroe thought were side effects. Namely, that he started seeing bright lights that would shine on hi, while conducting the experiments. In some cases, Monroe also reported episodes of sleep paralysis. This culminated with Monroe experiencing the sensation of leaving his body.

All of this would be chronicled in 1971 when Monroe released his book, Journeys Out Of The Mind. The book was a huge success and brought a new phrase to the world: the out-of-body experience. Of course, once word got out that there might be a way to expand one's mind, it was only a matter of time before the US government wanted to see if they could exploit it.

In 2003, the US government declassified a series of documents, one of which pertained to several CIA agents engaging in The Gateway Process at Monroe's R&D facility, which he had re-named the Monroe Institute. The declassified documents also described how the goal of the CIA was to see if it were possible to train one's mind to have an out-of-body experience and, if so, how far could one travel...and how to return?

The CIA report concluded that while several strange experiences occurred during The Gateway Process, most studies would need to be conducted in order to validate that out-ofbody experiences were indeed possible.

That's where the story ended, save for the fact that the CIA denies any other experiments were conducted. Oh, and the Monroe Institute now offers an 8-week course called The Gateway Experience, which is said to be the same procedures used by the CIA for the Gateway Process.

Thank you, Haunted America. I WILL be back!




FROM THE ARCHIVES


So back in the day, The Ghosts Of Ohio would gather with family and friends for the official GOO Summer Jamboree. Each year, we would try to find a state park or campground where we could all hang out, enjoy some grillables, and, most of all, be within walking distance of some haunted locations. After lunch or dinner (or both), we'd all pack up and head out in search of spooky things.

In the summer of 2011, we settled on Blue Limestone Park in Delaware, Ohio. Aside from being in close proximity to alleged haunted locations such as the Delaware Arts Castle and Ohio Wesleyan University, the park itself backs up to the Blue Limestone Quarry. According to legend, following a trail through the back of the quarry will lead you to a series of tunnels said to be home to a group of satanists and the ghosts of those who were sacrificed in the tunnels. There's also supposed to be a pond near some railroad tracks, said to be haunted by numerous people who drowned there while swimming...or after being involved in a train crash that ended with the passenger cars rolling into the pond.

The picture shows members of The Ghosts Of Ohio and some friends inside a small tunnel at the back of Blue Limestone Quarry. Some have referred to this as a "train tunnel", which while true, is a bit misleading. The train tracks are actually above the tunnel, which appears to have been built to allow trains to cross over the creek (visible on the right side of the photo). The creek feeds directly into Delaware Run.

It was a fun excursion, but it was ghost- and satanist-free. And while the stories certainly feel like urban legends, we were able to confirm that there was indeed a fatal train wreck in the area back around noon on Saturday, June 25, 1904. A Cleveland-to-Columbus express train was running almost 2 hours behind when it came speeding through Delaware. Unable to navigate a sharp turn, the engine and a baggage car left the tracks and crashed in a dish. Three people were killed with 10 others sustaining injuries. However, it should be noted that this particular accident did not take place at the railroad tracks in Blue Limestone. Rather, it was in the opposite direction and closer to downtown-near the Big Four Depot.


RIP WEIRD OHIO
